

Double the Express Lanes to debut soon on I-15
Commuters need to be aware of one more closure

Look for a new and improved Interstate 15 (I-15) on Monday, June 27. That's when commuters, after enduring nine days of delays because of an unavoidable Express Lanes closure, get their reward. Four Express Lanes, double the previous, will open.

But that's not all of the improvements. A number of new exits and entrances will now be available, particularly for commuters from the Mira Mesa and Scripps Ranch communities. This marks a major change to the old Express Lane system, which had but one exit and entrance when it was built 25 years ago. Additionally, the northbound entrance to the Express Lanes from SR 163 will reopen to traffic. This entrance had been closed for two months.

The South Segment of the \$1.3 billion project is now nearly finished - one year ahead of schedule. One final construction phase is necessary, however. It will cause an extended closure - about three months - of the I-15 Express Lanes entrance and exit near the split at I-15 and SR 163. This entrance and exit will be relocated and detour signs will be posted. Impact is not expected to be severe.
