Sabre Springs/Peñasquitos Transit Station Fact Sheet

Beginning early 2013, construction will start at the Sabre Springs/Peñasquitos Transit Station located at 13538 Sabre Springs Parkway. The upgraded station will accommodate the new Interstate 15 (I-15) Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service which will launch in 2014.

Operated by the Metropolitan Transit System (MTS), this high-frequency Express Bus service will connect residential areas with major employment centers, including Downtown San Diego, UCSD, and Escondido. Services will run more often, offering increased reliability, and customer convenience. Direct Access Ramps (DARs) will connect the new, upgraded transit stations to the I-15 Express Lanes.

Project Features

This station will include a new parking structure and added surface parking for a total of 630 spaces. Other improvements include an enhanced bus staging area, I-15 BRT-branded shelters, next bus arrival signs, new landscaping, a photovoltaic system, electric vehicle charging stations, fuel-efficient and smart vehicle spaces, security cameras, and a modular bicycle parking facility. As the first design-build project for SANDAG, this station will be built on an accelerated schedule, saving time and money.

The current Sabre Springs/Peñasquitos Transit Station will be closed while construction is underway. Parking and MTS Express Bus service will be relocated


to other existing Park & Ride lots nearby. Express Lanes access will remain open during construction.

Schedule Overview

Construction is anticipated to begin in February/March 2013 and will last approximately 12 months.

Funding

The total project cost is estimated at \$12.2 million. Funding for the I-15 BRT Transit Projects comes from *TransNet*, the regional half-cent sales tax approved by voters in 2004 and administered by SANDAG. This project is another example of SANDAG fulfilling the *TransNet* promise to deliver more transportation choices to the San Diego region.
