At the meeting, SANDAG plans to inform the public about the project, including the environmental review process and the route alternatives selected for further evaluation. Additionally, the team will provide a short recap of the Nov. 17 South Bay BRT public meeting at which several route alternatives and the draft criteria used to evaluate them were presented.

The project is a 21-mile rapid, reliable, high-frequency transit service between the Otay Mesa border crossing and downtown San Diego via eastern Chula Vista. The project will be built by SANDAG, which is currently conducting an environmental impact report on the South Bay BRT. This meeting is the second of three SANDAG will host in the community during the environmental review process.

The BRT, which will be operated by the Metropolitan Transit System, is expected to go into service in 2014.
