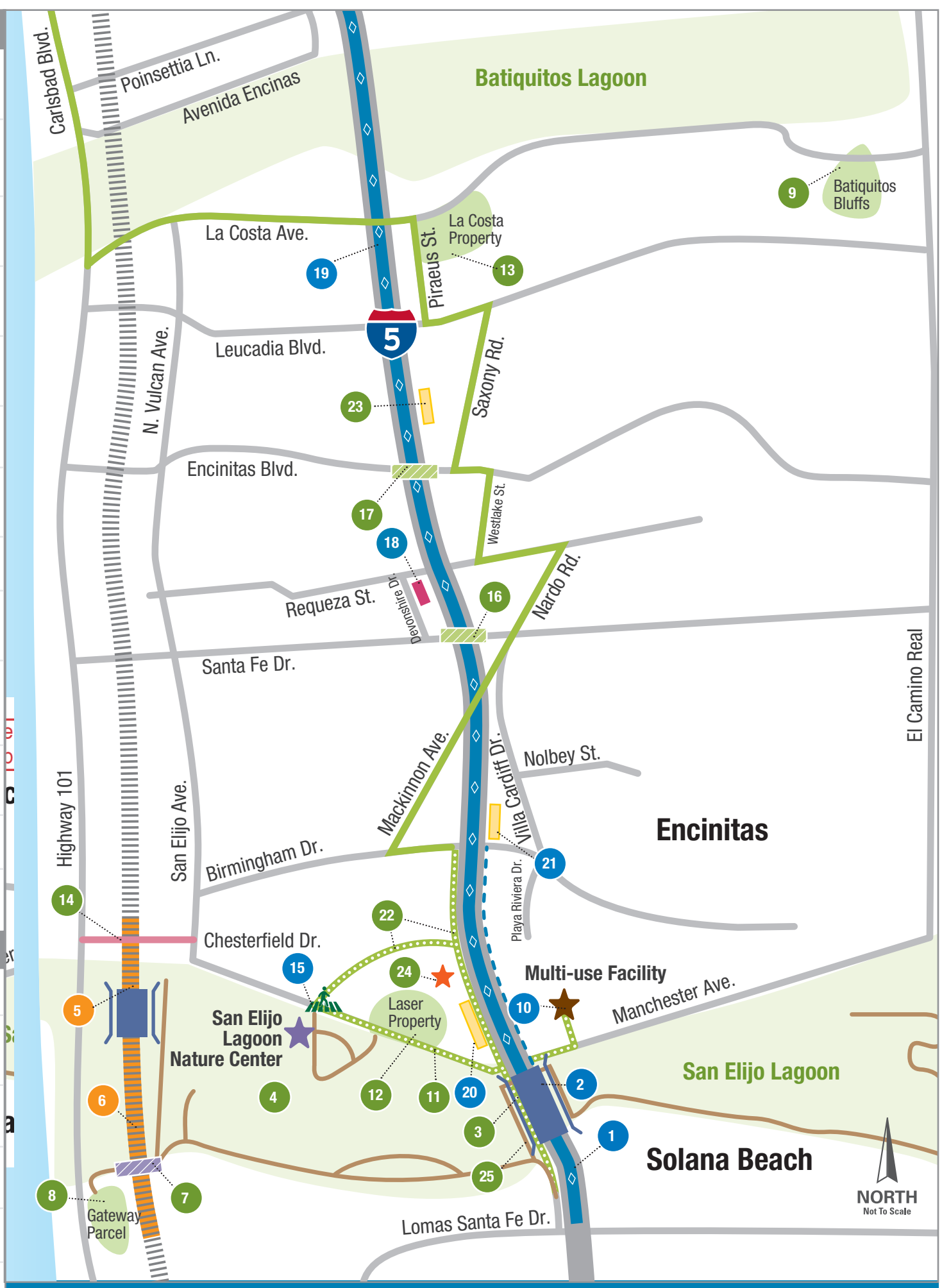




- Construction Began Early 2017**
- 1** **Carpool/HOV Lanes from Lomas Santa Fe Dr. to Birmingham Dr.**  
Add one Carpool/HOV Lane in each direction on I-5 from Lomas Santa Fe Dr. to Birmingham Dr.
  - 2** **San Elijo Lagoon Highway Bridge Replacement**  
Replace the San Elijo Lagoon highway bridge with a wider, longer bridge to accommodate added carpool lanes and improve lagoon tidal flow.
  - 3** **San Elijo Lagoon Highway Bike/Ped Suspension Bridge**  
Add a bike/pedestrian bridge underneath the highway bridge to improve lagoon connections.
  - 4** **San Elijo Lagoon Restoration**  
Restore and enhance the San Elijo Lagoon as part of an effort to protect sensitive coastal habitats in the North Coast Corridor.
  - 5** **San Elijo Lagoon Rail Bridge Replacement**  
Replace the San Elijo Lagoon rail bridge with a wider, longer bridge to accommodate a second track and improve lagoon tidal flow.
  - 6** **San Elijo Lagoon Rail Double Track**  
Double track 1.5 miles of the rail line between Solana Beach and Montgomery Ave.
  - 7** **San Elijo Lagoon Rail Pedestrian Undercrossing**  
Construct a rail pedestrian undercrossing at the southern end of the San Elijo Lagoon.
  - 8** **Gateway Parcel**  
Preserve open space near Cardiff State Beach.
  - 9** **Batiquitos Bluffs**  
Preserve and restore two parcels equaling 50.5 acres of native upland and wetland habitat previously slated for development. Acquired in 2015.
  - 10** **Manchester Ave. Multi-use Facility**  
Provide parking for carpools/vanpools and include bike lockers, electric vehicle charging stations, and recreational access to the San Elijo Lagoon and the new North Coast Bike Trail.
  - 11** **Class 2 Manchester Ave. Bike Path**  
Create a separated bike path connecting the future Manchester Ave. Multi-use Facility to the San Elijo Lagoon Nature Center.
  - 12** **Laser Property Site**  
Preserve 4.9 acres of coastal habitat near San Elijo Lagoon.
  - 13** **La Costa Property Site**  
Preserve 21.65 acres of coastal habitat near Batiquitos Lagoon.
- Construction Began 2018**
- 14** **Chesterfield Improvements**  
Improve the at-grade rail crossing at Chesterfield Dr.
  - 15** **Manchester Ave. Cross-Walk**  
Add a cross-walk at the intersection near the San Elijo Lagoon Nature Center and San Elijo Water Reclamation Facility.
  - 16** **Santa Fe Dr. Interchange**  
Add bike and pedestrian paths at the I-5/Santa Fe Dr. Interchange.
  - 17** **Encinitas Blvd. Interchange**  
Add bike and pedestrian paths at the I-5/Encinitas Blvd. Interchange.
  - 18** **Devonshire Dr. Privacy Wall**  
Construct a privacy wall at Devonshire Dr.
  - 19** **Carpool/HOV Lanes from Birmingham Dr. to Palomar Airport Rd.**  
Add one Carpool/HOV Lane in each direction on I-5 from Birmingham Dr. to Palomar Airport Rd.
  - 20** **Cardiff Cove Sound Wall**  
Construct a sound wall near the Cardiff Cove Community.
  - 21** **Birmingham Drive Sound Wall**  
Construct a sound wall at the Birmingham Dr. northbound on-ramp.
- Construction Began 2019**
- 22** **Manchester Ave. to Birmingham Dr. Bike Connection**  
Add separated bike paths adjacent to the San Elijo JPA Water Reclamation Facility to connect the North Coast Bike Trail.
  - 23** **Saxony Condominium Park Sound Wall**  
Construct a sound wall adjacent to the Saxony Condominiums.
  - 24** **Vista Point**  
Construct a view point including seating, bike and vehicle parking.
  - 25** **Solana Hills Lower Walking Trail**  
Enhance and lengthen access to the Solana Hills Trail with a decomposed granite surfacing path to the San Elijo Lagoon bike and pedestrian suspension bridge.
