



Northbound I-5 Closure from Carlsbad Village Drive to SR 78

On **Tuesday night, May 24**, Caltrans and SANDAG Build NCC crews are conducting a planned closure of Northbound Interstate 5 (I-5) in the City of Carlsbad. This closure will allow crews to temporarily relocate overhead sign structures, spanning all lanes of travel. The \$870 million Build NCC project includes \$195 million in funding from Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) and \$322 million in SANDAG TransNet funding.



The closure will **begin Tuesday, May 24, at 10 p.m., and reopen at 5 a.m. on Wednesday, May 25, from Carlsbad Village Drive to SR 78.** Northbound motorists must exit at Carlsbad Village Drive and detour using El Camino Real to SR 78. Motorists can re-enter northbound I-5 from SR 78. Detour signage will be in place to guide motorists around this closure.

**Please note, construction schedules are subject to change due to rain, fog, and cold temperatures.*

Nearby residents and businesses can expect nighttime construction noise and lights, including OSHA required vehicle back-up alarms. Crews will work to minimize noise and impacts to all nearby communities, and motorists will be detoured with signage and traffic controls.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through

construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1. For more information about other transportation projects funded by SB 1, visit Rebuildingca.ca.gov.

A total of \$322 million in TransNet funding, the voter-approved half-cent sales tax administered by SANDAG, is allocated to the Build NCC package of highway, rail, environmental, and coastal access improvement projects. SANDAG leverages these funds with state and federal resources to improve the region's transportation infrastructure.
