



Temporary Chain Link Fences to be Installed This Week

As part of the San Elijo Lagoon Double Track Project and to ensure public safety, construction crews will install temporary chain link fences this week around rail construction staging areas in Cardiff-by-the-Sea. Community members are encouraged to use the safe, legal crossings at Chesterfield Drive and Santa Fe Drive.

Additionally, crews will begin work on Monday, April 3, to build a work berm, or temporary work platform, near the northern end of the rail bridge over the San Elijo Lagoon. As part of the work to construct the temporary work platform, crews will install piles, which act as a support structure for the platform. The temporary work platform will allow crews to safely access the rail bridge so they can begin construction activities.

The work will occur over the next several weeks, Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Some night work may be required.

Nearby residents can expect construction noise, lights, large cranes, and heavy equipment within the project area. Crews will work to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents. Your patience during construction is appreciated.



About the San Elijo Lagoon Double Track Project

The San Elijo Lagoon Double Track Project is a \$72.8 million project that will add 1.5 miles of new double track from Cardiff-by-the-Sea to the southern border of the San Elijo Lagoon, replace the wooden trestle bridge over the San Elijo Lagoon with a modern concrete bridge, construct a new pedestrian undercrossing at the south end of the lagoon, and improve the signal and grade crossing at Chesterfield Drive. This project is part of Build NCC and will take approximately two years to complete.
