



The list below shows planned closures and detours as part of highway, rail, bike, pedestrian, and lagoon improvement projects. Detour signs will be placed, as needed, to assist motorists through closures. Please note, these closures are subject to change.

Week of June 10

HIGHWAY

- Motorists should expect intermittent ramp closures, lane closures, and reduced lane widths along Encinitas Boulevard and Santa Fe Drive at Interstate 5 (I-5) from Sunday, June 10, through Thursday, June 14, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for crews to work on retaining wall construction.
- Motorists should expect intermittent ramp closures, lane closures, and reduced lane widths along Manchester Avenue at Interstate 5 (I-5) from Sunday, June 10, through Thursday, June 14, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for crews to work on road paving, ramp paving, and retaining wall work.
- **Saturday, June 9 - Sunday, June 10:** Motorists are advised that westbound Manchester Avenue will be closed at Interstate 5 (I-5) between the northbound off-ramp and the southbound on-ramp, beginning 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, June 9 through 3 a.m. on Sunday, June 10. This closure is required to allow construction crews to conduct paving work on the road under I-5. Detours signs will be placed.
 - Motorists should expect narrowed lanes and a traffic shift to the north side of Manchester Avenue beginning Sunday, June 10. The traffic configuration and the number of lanes will remain the same.

RAIL

- Residents near San Elijo Avenue, just north of the San Elijo Lagoon in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, can expect intermittent daytime construction noise, flagging, and traffic delays from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday, June 11, through Friday, June 15, as crews construct a new curb and gutter, and install new railroad track.

LAGOON/BIKE/PEDESTRIAN

- Residents and businesses near San Elijo Avenue, between Chesterfield Drive and Santa Fe Drive in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, can expect intermittent daytime construction noise from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday, June 11 through Friday, June 15, as crews continue work on the Coastal Rail Trail bike path.
- Residents, businesses, and visitors may experience increased activity and noise along Cardiff State Beach in the City of Encinitas due to on-going beach sand replenishment activities.
