



The list below shows planned closures and detours as part of highway, rail, bike, pedestrian, and lagoon improvement projects. Detour signs will be placed, as needed, to assist motorists through closures. Please note, these closures are subject to change.

Week of September 16

HIGHWAY

- Motorists should expect intermittent ramp closures, lane closures, flagging operations, and reduced lane widths along Manchester Avenue at Interstate 5 (I-5) from Sunday, September 16, through Thursday, September 20, from 9 p.m. – 5 a.m. for bridge and road construction.
- Motorists should expect intermittent ramp closures, lane closures, flagging operations, and reduced lane widths along Encinitas Boulevard and Santa Fe Drive at Interstate 5 (I-5) from Sunday, September 16, through Thursday, September 20, from 9 p.m. – 5 a.m. for retaining wall work as part of the bike and pedestrian undercrossing improvements.

RAIL

- Residents near San Elijo Avenue, just north of the San Elijo Lagoon in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, can expect intermittent daytime construction noise, flagging, and traffic delays from Monday, September 17, through Friday, September 21, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. for continued work on the new railroad track.
- Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures, flagging operations, and reduced lane widths near the intersection of Chesterfield Drive and Coast Highway 101 from Monday, September 17 through Friday, September 21, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. for electrical work in the intersection.
- **Saturday, September 22:** Residents and motorists can expect intermittent daytime construction noise between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. as utility providers relocate fiber cables lines along the rail line near the trestle rail bridge.

LAGOON/BIKE/PEDESTRIAN

- Residents and businesses near San Elijo Avenue, between Chesterfield Drive and Santa Fe Drive, in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, can expect intermittent daytime construction noise, flagging, and traffic delays from Monday, September 17, through Friday, September 21, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., for continued work on the Coastal Rail Trail bike path.
