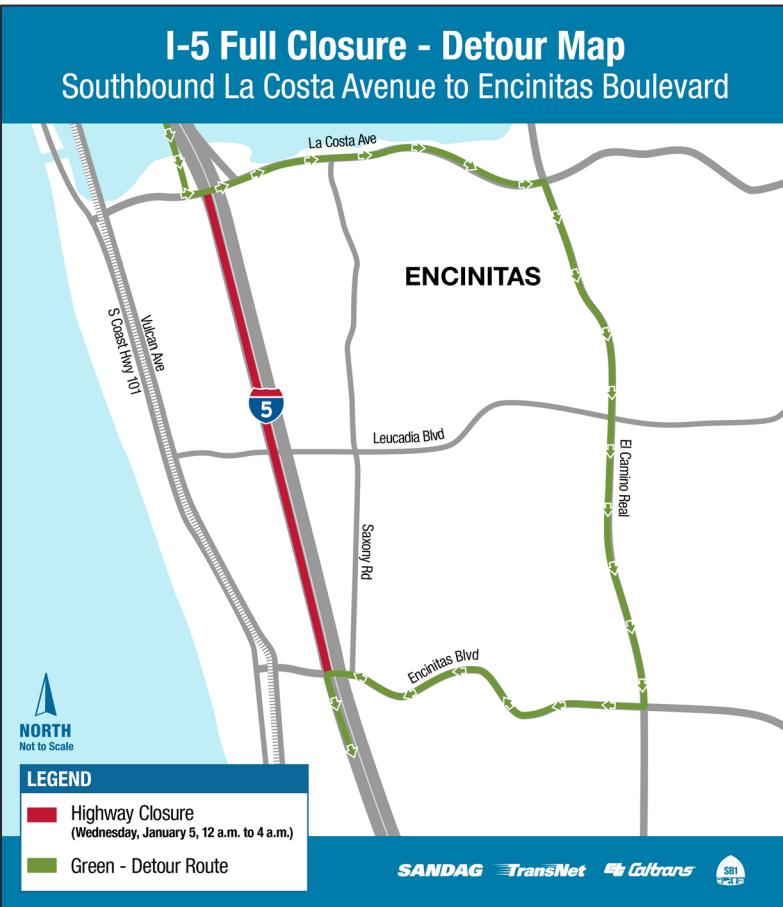

Upcoming Southbound I-5 Full Freeway Closure from La Costa Avenue to Encinitas Boulevard

On **Wednesday, January 5**, Caltrans and SANDAG Build NCC crews are conducting a planned Southbound Interstate 5 (I-5) full closure in the City of Encinitas. This closure will allow crews to install an overhead sign structure, from the median to the outside shoulder, spanning all lanes of travel. The \$870 million Build NCC project includes \$195 million in funding from Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) and \$322 million in TransNet funding.



The closure will **begin Wednesday, January 5, at 12 a.m., and reopen at 4 a.m. from La Costa Avenue to Encinitas Boulevard**. Southbound motorists must exit at La Costa Avenue and detour using El Camino Real. Motorists can re-enter southbound I-5 at Encinitas Boulevard. Detour signage will be in place to guide motorists around this closure.

**Please note, construction schedules are subject to change due to rain, fog, and cold temperatures.*

Nearby residents and businesses can expect nighttime construction noise and lights, including [OSHA required vehicle back-up alarms](#). Crews will work to minimize noise and impacts to all nearby communities, and motorists will be detoured with signage and traffic controls.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that

A total of \$322 million in TransNet funding, the voter-approved half-cent sales tax administered by SANDAG, is allocated to the Build NCC package of highway, rail, environmental, and coastal access improvement projects. SANDAG leverages these funds with state and federal resources to improve the region’s transportation infrastructure.
